Last year more than 1,300 productions were entered in the KCACTF involving more than 200,000 students nationwide. By entering this production, our theater department is sharing in the KCACTF goals to recognize, reward, and celebrate the exemplary work produced in college and university theaters across the nation.

DIRECTOR NOTE

We want so badly to reach our youth and assure them that no matter what you are going through, who you are, who you love... you are held in love by all that is. All around us we see sanitized versions of what we hope to solve in the hearts of our young ones, but the truth is, what lies within their hearts is achingly, blazingly complex and not easily solved. Our play speaks to the dangers not only in offering simplified, dogmatic solutions divorced from real experience or courageous, honest discussion; but also in the follies of complete and utter rejection of any caution or guidance for the sake of youthful idealism. An extremely frank depiction of teenage self-discovery, sex, violence, and suicide; there is a reason the original play was banned from the stage and not performed in its complete form in English for nearly 100 years. A good play will not proselytize, it will ask hard questions. We endeavor to do the same...



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


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


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
